

The Committee on Licenses met on Monday, June 14, 2010.

The meeting was audio taped for the record.

Members present were Alderman L. Charles DiPerri, presiding and Aldermen Robert Van Campen and Michael Marchese.

The Committee considered a Petition extension for Lodging House Renewal from Joseph's Lodge at 312-314 Broadway for lodging house/room rental until December 31,2010..

The Petitioner Joseph Fustolo, Lodging House Manager John Fustolo and Attorney Richard Vitali were also present as was City Clerk Michael Matarazzo.

The Committee was in receipt of an updated Police Report for this location showing six (6) incidents.

Attorney Vitali informed the Committee that John Fustolo had moved onto to the property and would now be the on site Manager. Alderman Marchese stated that he was satisfied with the improvement.

Alderman Van Campen remarked that he was happy with the on site Manager but asked that the License Committee be notified if the on site Manager moves out.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Aldermen with a recommendation for favorable action.

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Members present were Alderman L. Charles DiPerri, presiding and Aldermen Robert Van Campen and Michael Marchese.

The Committee considered an Order offered by Alderman Robert Van Campen, as President: To grant the petition from Joseph Marchese, Esquire, with a certified plot plan in support of Supreme Cars petition to increase the number of cars on its license from 15 to 21...

The Petitioner Joseph Marchese was also present as was City Clerk Michael Matarazzo.

The Committee reviewed the Certified plot plan. Mr. Marchese informed the Committee that employee and 6 customer parking spots would be done the center of the lot.

The Committee recommended that the Building Department review and approve first.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Aldermen with a recommendation for favorable action pending approval from the Building Department.

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Members present were Alderman L. Charles DiPerri, presiding and Aldermen Robert Van Campen and Michael Marchese. Also present was Alderman Millie Cardello.

The Committee considered an Order offered by Alderman Robert Van Campen, as President: To grant the petition from Joseph Marchese, Jr. with request to amend the Junk Dealer License issued May 17, 2010 of Wentworth Precious Metals, LLC of 0 Terminal Street and 431 Second Street to include in addition and conjunction thereto materials recovery facility and materials recycling facility.

The Petitioner Joseph Marchese was also present as was City Clerk Michael Matarazzo.

Mr. Marchese informed the Committee that he met with the Building Inspector who recommended the Licenses in order to comply with zoning in the area. He provided the Committee with an overview of the property he planned on purchasing and reviewed the proposed plan for a building structure on the site. He indicated that the site would contain only ferrous and non ferrous material. He assured the Committee that no construction material would be brought on the site. Upon questioning from Alderman Cardello, Mr. Marchese explained the operation of the business and the equipment on site. He noted that there would be very few big trucks on site and expected that they would only be there for a maximum ten minutes. Alderman Van Campen informed the Committee that this would be the first business to apply for the materials recovery facility and materials recycling facility license, which he stated was a good thing.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Aldermen with a recommendation for favorable action.
