

The Committee on Licenses met on Monday, June 28, 2010.

The meeting was audio taped for the record.

Members present were Alderman L. Charles DiPerri, presiding and Aldermen Robert Van Campen and Michael Marchese.

The Committee considered a Petition from Planet Tran, LLC for renewal and expansion of Livery Garage License to 25-50 vehicles for Planet Trans's all hybrid livery fleet at 3 Charlton Place..

The Petitioner Seth Riney, President & Founder of Planet Tran was also present as was City Clerk Michael Matarazzo.

Mr. Riney explained that he was in the business to provide alternate and more environmentally friendly transportation means by providing hybrid vehicles in contrast to using taxi or limousine services. He informed the Committee that he had a sister operation in San Francisco, California and was looking to make the City of Everett its base on the East Coast. He stated that he was leasing 10,000 square feet in the old Bolt building on Charlton Place Upon questioning from Alderman DiPerri, Mr. Riney acknowledged that all maintenance of the vehicles were outsourced and was not performed on site. He also stated that there was ample parking for his employees around the building and if needed they could park in the building.

Mr. Matarazzo informed the Committee that all approvals from the respective City Department Heads had been received. Mr. Matarazzo also informed the Committee that he was in receipt of a communication from the Landlord of the property confirming that he did indeed have a lease agreement with Planet Tran.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Aldermen with a recommendation for favorable action.

The Committee was informed that the matter was back before the body as was requested at the May 10, 2010 License Committee meeting to allow the City Clerk the opportunity to conduct periodic inspections over a 30 day period. In addition, the Committee had requested an update from City Solicitor Colleen Mejia on the Court case with the business operation.

Mr. Matarazzo reported that he had conducted several site inspections and found no cars for sale nor did he witness any vehicles being parked on the sidewalk. Ms. Mejia reported that this was not a court case rather a Code Enforcement matter with all fines paid in full by the Petitioner.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Aldermen with a recommendation for favorable action.
